At Your Service... In Memory of Marion Anderson

You might expect someone who owns a restaurant to understand the importance of good service, but for Marion Anderson and her husband, Edgar, “good” was never enough.

As the owners of the beloved local restaurant, The Kopper Kettle, they knew guests by name, greeting each one as if they were family members.

Marion, who passed away recently at the age of 92, lived at Fairport Baptist Homes for the last three and a half years of her life, and was every bit as gracious here as she was when she hosted diners at the family business for over 41 years.

“Yes, gracious—that’s the word for it—she was one of the most gracious people I’ve ever met,” commented one of her fellow household members at the service held for Marion at FBH a few days after her passing. Added one of the staff who frequently cared for her, “She’d never fail to say thank you—even for something that might seem like a small gesture. She was always grateful for whatever I’d do for her.”

of gratitude early in life: After completing two years of college, it was the generous donation of an anonymous benefactor that enabled her to complete her studies at Tufts University. “She never forgot that,” her daughter, Andrea, comments, “and it impressed upon her the need to help others, just as she was helped at a critical time in her life.”

Marion wasn’t one for material possessions, but she did enjoy collecting one thing in particular—buttons! Andrea brought a large

suitcase with her to her mother’s service, and shared its contents with those in attendance. “Help yourself to a memento,” she encouraged residents and staff, “that’s what my mom would have wanted!”

One staff member found a button with cheerful, cartoon-like people on it, while another selected one that looked like a small globe, with North and South America on it. “I love to travel, so this is particularly appropriate,” she said.

Andrea commented that her mother lived her final years at FBH, as she did her whole life, with grace, dignity, and a love for the company of others. “We are very grateful for the care she received—we know it wasn’t easy leaving her home when she first came to FBH, but everyone made her feel welcome, which eased her transition.”

Thanks to the staff who cared for her, and the generous donors whose gifts make life extra special here, a very lovely lady’s final years were as wonderful as she was.

Kopper Kettle Swedish Rye Bread

INGREDIENTS

1 tbsp dry yeast
2 cups warm water
4 tsp brown sugar
3 cups white rye flour*
1/2 cup oil or shortening
2 tsp salt
2 tbsp molasses
1 tsp fennel seed
2 tbsp orange marmalade or orange zest
4 cups all-purpose flour

DIRECTIONS

In the base of a mixing bowl, dissolve yeast and brown sugar in warm water.
Mix in the white rye flour and then let the mixture bubble up for at least a half an hour.
Add oil, salt, molasses, fennel seed, marmalade or orange zest and all-purpose flour. Knead until smooth and elastic.
Place in a greased bowl, cover with cloth until double in bulk.
Punch down, knead slightly and shape into two loaves.
Place in greased pans, cover with cloth until double in bulk.
Bake at 350 for 35-40 minutes. Cool on rack.

* White rye flour is available at Niblack at the Rochester Regional Market, Jefferson Road. Using straight rye flours will make a much denser bread, take longer to rise, and without the characteristic sweetness of the Kopper Kettle Swedish Rye.




WELCOME TO OUR NEWEST BOARD MEMBERS


